1. **Don't equate** \_\_\_\_\_.

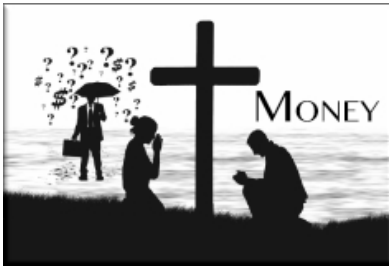
One lie that money tells is, "I'm a blessing from God, and a sign that you are ok."

**Let me be clear – This parable does not say that rich people go to hell because they are rich – or that poor people go to heaven because they are poor.**

2. **Make sure** \_\_\_\_\_.

Another lie that money tells is – "I'm all you need."

The stakes are high – the consequences eternal – place your trust in Christ alone.

4. In the sermon, Pastor Marty asked two important questions that help us to diagnose the condition of our own hearts. What do you need more, God or money? Which do you pursue more, God or money? Do the answers to those questions line up? How can you increase your pursuit of God?
5. Marty said that he thought the rich man was surprised to find himself in Hades. What do you think? Why? How important is it to know your eternal destiny?
