Luke 17:7-10 - “Will any one of you who has a servant plowing or keeping sheep say to him when he has come in from the field, ‘Come at once and recline at table’? ⁸Will he not rather say to him, ‘Prepare supper for me, and dress properly, and serve me while I eat and drink, and afterward you will eat and drink’? ⁹Does he thank the servant because he did what was commanded? ¹⁰So you also, when you have done all that you were commanded, say, ‘We are unworthy servants; we have only done what was our duty.’”

Home Group/Study Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the truths we are learning.

Large Group

1. Was there any passage of scripture or statement in the message today that was particularly meaningful to you?

Small Group

2. Read **Psalm 46:10**. When is the last time you set aside time to "be still and know that I am God?" Spending time reflecting on the might and majesty of God makes sure that He is exalted among the nations, in the world, and specifically in our minds. What are some things you do that cause you to be in awe of God?
3. Generally speaking, do you know your purpose in life? If you google "What is my purpose in life?" you'll get hundreds of websites with ways to help you "discover" your life's purpose. (Some are hilarious.) As believers, though, we learn our purpose in life through our study of God's Word. Pastor Marty said that YOUR purpose is to serve your King, in ways He tells you, empowered by the Holy Spirit. Do you agree? How are you currently serving Him?
4. Read **1 Thessalonians 1:2-3**. Are you able to "Take Joy in Your Service," or do you find it nothing but draining? The Christians at Thessalonica had faith, love, and hope, enabling them to work, labor, and be steadfast. How can you change your perspective from working "for" God, to resting in God – while you work?
5. While the master in our passage did not owe the servant praise for simply doing His duty, we do see in scripture that God knows our works, that He is pleased with our obedience, and that He rewards us. Read **Hebrews 11:6**. What are the challenges and blessings in this verse? What will you do this week to "diligently seek Him?"
