These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the truths we are learning.

Large Group

1. Was there any passage of scripture or statement in the message today that was particularly meaningful or applicable to you?

Small Group

2. Read **Job 25:1-6**. Though Bildad may have been a "miserable comforter" (Job 16:2), his words certainly capture the concept of the unmatched and transcendent holiness of God (cf. Isaiah 6:1-7). Why do most people today have such a low view of God and high view of themselves? In conversation, how would you "declare the glory of God?"
3. Read **Psalms 19:7-14**. How do God's commands teach us about the perfection and holiness of God?
4. Read **Ecclesiastes 7:20**, **Romans 3:9-12**, and **Matthew 5:20**. How good do you have to be to be right with God? What are some ways you can help complacent people see their need of salvation?
5. Read **Psalms 51:1-5**. What is the difference between admitting "I am a sinner" and understanding the gravity of sin the way the psalmist does in this passage?
6. Read **1 Peter 1:18-19**. Put in your own words what it means to be redeemed by the "precious blood of Christ," as though you were explaining it to an interested listener. How does keeping this truth in our daily thoughts help us to value and cherish our salvation?
